Renewing Our Shepherd Lutheran Campaign Issue 1 | June 27, 2019

Campaign Announced

We are pleased to announce the launching of a very special campaign effort for the benefit of Our Shepherd Lutheran Church. It's entitled the *Renewing Our Shepherd Campaign* and its aim is raising the funds required to complete needed repairs to our church and school buildings.

Our minimum goal is to raise \$1,500,000 which will enable us to replace our roofs and the single pane windows on our buildings at both campuses, replace failing HVAC systems, improve our parking lots and add security lighting on both campuses. A challenge goal of \$2,500,000 also has been set which, if met, will enable us to remodel school classrooms, bathrooms and the office; restore the organ and install more security cameras in the parking lots; renovate the Lower Level of the church, and complete landscaping and signage.

The campaign will officially commence with a special *Kick-Off Celebration* scheduled for Sunday, July 21 and



will culminate on Saturday and Sunday, September 7 and 8. Commitment Weekend is when members will be asked to make their campaign gift commitments.

The pages that follow provide additional details about our needs, our plans, and our campaign. Through the prayerful, volunteer, and financial support of many, we will succeed in our task. In so doing, we will help make Our Shepherd Lutheran an even more special and spectacular place to go and to grow in God's name.

Campaign Leadership Enlisted

O ur campaign leadership *cabinet* is now in place. This critical core group of leaders will give guidance and drive the overall campaign.



Serving as Chairpersons of this special effort are **Michele and Tom Shoan**, who will assume primary responsibility for the Advance Gifts Committee and phase of the campaign and **Meg Perrault**, who will oversee the Community Gifts Committee and phase.

In addition, we have been blessed with an excellent supporting cast who are tasked with leading our other necessary campaign committees. They are Jessica Merz and Jill Hoegemeyer, who will lead our Prayer Committee; Ronda Klausmeier, who will lead our committee for Hospitality; Lauren Kehoe, who will lead our committee for Youth and Children's Gifts; Stacey and John Carlson, who will lead our Communications Committee; and Ron Chewning, who will lead our Creative Giving Committee.

Finally, we also are blessed to already have the following people step up and agree to serve on our Advance Gifts Team - the group of volunteers who will be visiting a select group of members in advance of commitment weekend and inviting them to consider their gifts. Our Needs

Our church, school, and childcare buildings require updating and repair. In many ways, our facilities have become like homes that have been lived in for decades – where we tolerate leaky faucets, inefficient roofs and windows, and outdated, nonfunctional basements.

We are called to look with new eyes and be the best stewards of what God has entrusted to our care. This means we must ensure our school, childcare, and church are ready to meet the growing needs of our children and their children. Maintaining our facilities is critical to our mission to gather, nurture and serve because Jesus loves.

We recently engaged a nationally recognized facility and engineering consulting firm to assess our infrastructure needs at our church and school campuses. At the forefront of their recommendations were various infrastructure improvements.

The roofs over the six classrooms at our church, and the roofs at our school, are leaking. This has caused significant water damage to our ceilings that require constant, costly maintenance.

Our church and school buildings have their old, original windows that are energy inefficient, drafty and

they leak in strong rains. In fact, in some classrooms, teachers have to plug leaky holes with sponges and children are advised to dress warm to be comfortable on cold weather days, all because our outdated heating system struggles to keep up to warm the cold air that seeps in through our windows.

Some years ago, we replaced the heating, ventilation, and air conditioning system in the sanctuary and lower level. However, the HVAC systems in the rest of our facilities are inadequate. The HVAC systems in the church education wing and in the school gym are unable to heat the rooms properly on cold winter days. They struggle to keep up to counter the warm and cold air coming in through old windows, and not surprisingly, require repeated repair costing thousands of dollars each year.

Our parking lots at both church and school also need resurfacing. Over the years we have spent money on patching them, but due to poor drainage those patches retain water and the potholes get bigger, especially in winter. In fact, our contractors have strongly urged us to dig up all three layers and replace our existing asphalt. We also need more lighting and modern security cameras with wider coverage throughout our parking areas, especially in current times, where the personal safety of our staff, members, visitors, and school children cannot and should not be taken for granted.

Our signage and landscaping also look dated, and need a refreshed, inviting look.

In our church facility we need to make some improvements: The lower level is host to essential church activities. It is a weary space that requires new carpet and ceiling tiles, and improved lighting.

Our organ, which was built in 1965, is progressively failing. When parts

break, many cannot be replaced because they are no longer manufactured or available. Pipes are sagging. Some notes don't play or get stuck. And our console needs to be replaced. Since we are known for our traditional worship and our pipe organ is an important part of our worship services, the time has come to address this need if we want to continue to be known for our excellence in worship.

Our church atrium entryway too, needs a renovated look, so that we can see the altar as we walk in, rather than a wall and a door. Renovating the doors leading into the sanctuary, and replacing the outdated and worn carpet, will be very inviting and showcase our unique architecture.

Additionally, we don't have the proper audio-visual and recording equipment, cameras or lighting in the chancel to record and live-stream our services, which would be a way to reach more people, attract more members to our church, and serve our members who may be homebound or sick.

Additionally, our school building does not meet the needs of today's families and students.

Our restrooms in both the hallways and classrooms need updating and repairs. Many restrooms are dark and dingy, with outdated, leaky, plumbing fixtures.

The classroom cabinets and counters are from the 1960s and are not appealing or practical.

The school entryway is neither welcoming nor functional. Over time it has been repurposed, and the lobby, childcare and pastor's offices are not effective spaces. The school offices need to be renovated to combine our school and childcare staff into one functional space. The pastor's office needs to be relocated from its current position down the hallway.

Our Plans

The school gym sound system is ineffective, making it difficult to hear announcements and lead chapel.

To address these needs, we have exciting plans and a multi-faceted approach. At the forefront of our plans are various infrastructure improvements including the following:

We will replace the leaking roofs over six classrooms at the church and all roofs at the school.

Taking advantage of the reroofing work, we will also replace our dated and leaky windows with updated high-efficiency windows at the church and school, including our clerestory windows.

Additionally, our heating, ventilation and air conditioning system servicing the education wing at the church, the school, and gym, will be replaced with an improved, more energy and cost-efficient heating and cooling system. Together with the roof and window replacement, the new HVAC systems will ensure greater comfort and cost-savings.

Parking lot improvements involve removing the existing asphalt on all our church and school facility parking lots and the circle drive. New asphalt will be laid, sealed, and restriped for more efficient parking and traffic flow, and to ensure better drainage. Additional lighting and better security cameras with a broader view will also provide additional security to address safety concerns.

We also plan to enhance our exterior signage by replacing or improving the signage that faces the traffic that streams past our facilities every day. Improved landscaping also will add visual appeal and will frame our unique and striking church building.

Our church lower level will be remodeled to improve functionality and will include new carpeting, wallcovering, ceiling, and lighting. Working with an expert organ builder obsolete electro-pneumatic relay system will be replaced with a digital relay system and new organ console. Other needed improvements, like repairing the sagging pipes will be cared for.

The solid doors in our sanctuary entryway will be replaced with doors with windows, so that people arriving and entering our atrium can see directly into the sanctuary, drawing them into our worship space. This also provides a practical space for overflow seating at larger services and a place where parents can take their restless children and still participate in our services. Replacing the sanctuary carpeting will further heighten people's first impressions as they enter our church.


Modern audio-visual and recording equipment and lighting in the chancel will be installed, which will enable us to record and live-stream our services as a way to spread God's word to an even larger audience, attract more members, and provide a needed service to our existing members who may be homebound or sick.

We also plan to improve our school and childcare building in various ways.

First, we plan to update our school restrooms to make them more accessible, spacious and brighter, and replace the outdated plumbing.

We will renovate and repair the classroom restrooms and replace or repair classroom cabinets and counters to provide ample and appropriate storage for students and teachers.

Additionally, we will renovate the entryway to the school to make the lobby area more appealing and functional.



We will renovate the offices at the school, by combining our school and childcare staff into one safe and operational space, by relocating the office for the pastor, and integrating those with the main school office.

Finally, we will improve the audio/ visual system in our gym to make this space ready for chapel services, assemblies and sporting events.
