#10 – Expanding the Connecting Kids to Christ Tutoring Program - \$25,000

September is here, and for many the school year is on our minds. Some find school easy; some need some extra help. East Bethlehem Church in Detroit is reaching out to inner-city communities with tutoring in reading, vocabulary, and math and the Michigan Disrict LWML is helping to provide support. We have been blessed with an education, and with the chance to help others receive one. How great is our heavenly father in providing this opportunity!

In 1820, only 12% of the world population could read. Today, only 17% cannot – what a beautiful gift! About 20% of adults in the U.S., however, cannot read well – contributing significantly to life issues. In Detroit, only 7% of students can read at grade level. In addition, the school system ranked the lowest in the nation for mathematic skills.

The Michigan District LWML chose to support tutoring efforts in Detroit as one of its grants for this biennium. Please consider assisting in this support this month!


