This weekend we will look at two stories about the lost being found. We will rejoice that the one lost sheep was found by the shepherd that left the ninety-nine. The other story for this weekend is about the woman who searched doggedly until she found her lost coin. There is more theological importance to these stories than the assumption that the shepherd and woman should have bought a Tile to send out Bluetooth signals. This weekend rejoice that the mission of God is to seek and to save the lost.

Oakland Literacy Council

The OLC is a non-profit organization offering free, one-on-one tutoring to adults seeking basic literacy or English as a second language. Despite the affluence of Oakland County, approximately 100,000 residents are estimated to be functionally illiterate. These adults are unable to perform daily tasks you and I take for granted, such as writing a job application, deciphering a prescription label or reading to a child. The OLC wants to change that.

With a waiting list of over 100 students, we need more volunteer tutors. No experience is necessary. We will train you. Volunteers attend a six-hour training session at the Bloomfield Hills location and are then matched with a student who lives near them. Tutors commit to working with their student for two hours each week at either the local public library, a coffee shop or other public location. If you are interested, upcoming training sessions are on October 19th and November 20th.
